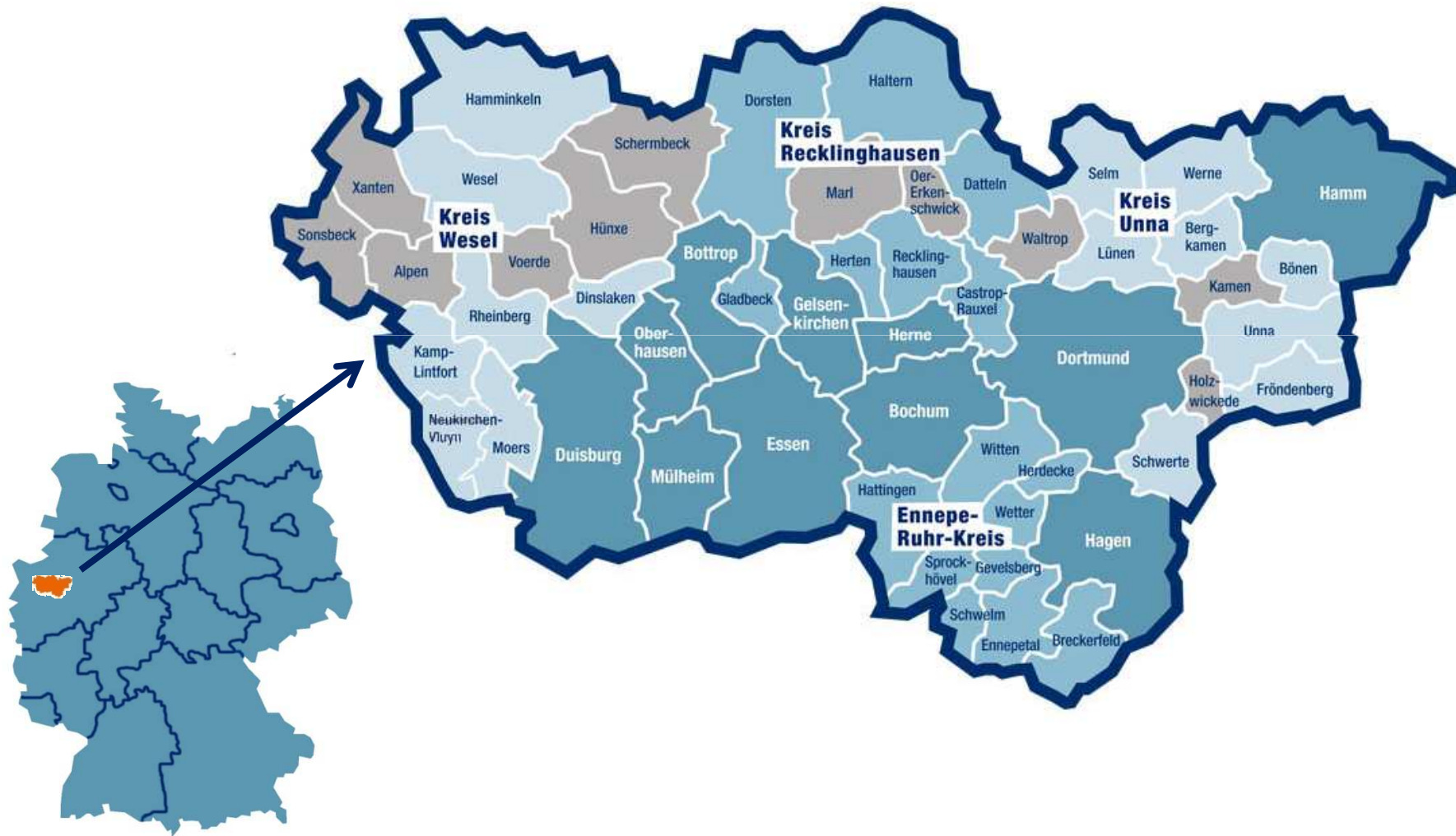
From project to programme – the history

- 2003:** Pilot Project of the Music School Bochum
- 2006:** The German Federal Culture Foundation and the State of North Rhine-Westphalia decide - together with the Foundation for the Future of Education under the umbrella of GLS Treuhand e.V. - to extend “An instrument for every child” to the whole area of the Ruhr region
- 2007** The Foundation Jedem Kind ein Instrument based in Bochum takes up employment (phase of introduction: 4 years)
- 2010:** Cooperation project of the RUHR.2010 European Capital of Culture
- 2011:** Termination of phase of introduction; the programme receives now external funding solely from the State of North Rhine-Westphalia. In the Ruhr region, JeKi attained the status as a continuous operation.

Introduction

- 34 music schools and 219 primary schools started with the beginning of school year 2007/08 with around 7.000 first graders. Up from school year 2008/2009, JeKi became school subject and belongs to the curriculum of the primary school. Since school year 2008/09, Special Education Centres participate in the programme.

First-Grade Education

- education in small classes (approx.: 23 children average)
- co-teaching (tandem: a teacher of the primary school together with a teacher of the music-school)
- 45 minutes per week
- curriculum: basic training in musical elements and background knowledge about the instruments taught
- students should pick their instrument of choice after the Easter holidays.

strings	woodwinds	brass	others	instruments from immigrants' home countries

Second to Fourth Grade Education

- learning and practicing on instruments of choice (borrowed from the music school, free of charge)
- lessons given by music-school-teacher in the rooms of the primary school
- small groups, average: 5 children
- 45 minutes per week, in accord with the class's schedule
- mixed groups possible (mixed strings – mixed brass – plucked instruments)
- experience of harmonies
- by the third year, additional 60 minutes per week of lessons in the “Ensemble Kunterbunt”, ensemble „Potpourri“
- goal: annual event at the end of each school year

Structure and Organization

The Foundation Jedem Kind ein Instrument

- coordination of implementation in the Ruhr region
- supra-regional duties and responsibilities (conception, consulting of the municipalities and the music schools, communication)
- financial transfers of 8,7 Million € p.a.
- development of supra-regional programs and challenges:
 - consultation concerning all aspects of implementing the programme (conception, communication, acquisition of instruments et cetera)
 - advanced training for teachers, teaching materials
 - programmes of research
 - information of the parents
 - communication
